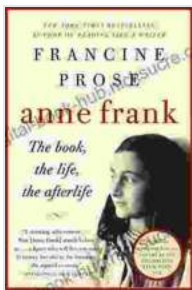


Anne Frank: The Life, The Afterlife

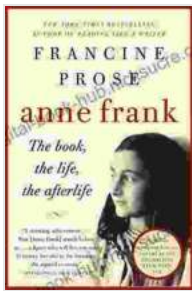

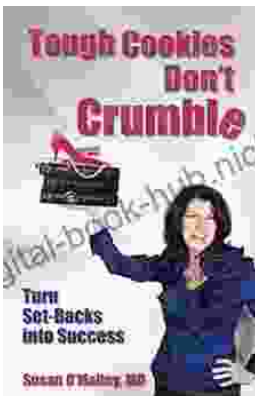
