Aphasia is a challenging condition, but with treatment, people with aphasia can learn to communicate and live full and active lives.

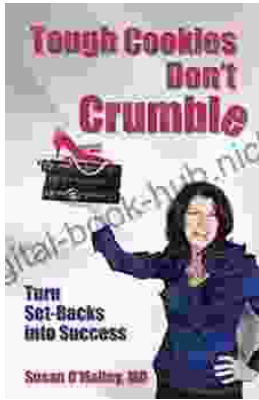


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
