


One such hero was John Chapman, a Master Sergeant in the United States Air Force. On March 4, 2002, during Operation Anaconda in Afghanistan, he performed an act of extraordinary bravery that earned him the Medal of Honor posthumously.

Early Life and Military Career

John Chapman was born on May 11, 1965, in Springfield, Massachusetts. He joined the United States Air Force in 1985 and became a pararescueman, also known as a "PJ." Legacy and Impact




