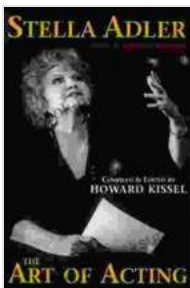


Stella Adler: The Art of Acting

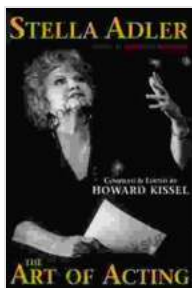
