

Diffusion of Responsibility

Involve a group of characters in the action.



Replacing Responsibility

Show that another character is responsible for the bad action.



Blaming the Victim

Turn the "bad guy" into the victim aka Revenge.



Favorable Comparison

Have a different character do a worse bad action.



Dehumanization


The audience may excuse an immoral act on an "inhuman" character.

Sociological Factors


